YMCA OF HAMILTON

A \$25,000 grant was awarded to support the YMCA of Hamilton Summer Camp Program for underserved children.

H20 HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

A \$10,000 grant was provided to NYC H2O to provide Water Ecology & Engineering Field Trips for Staten Island Public School Students at Silver Lake and Lemon Creek, and stewardship events at beaches and other natural areas in Staten Island, allowing students to experience a rare opportunity for outdoor/on-site environmental education.



GROUNDS FOR SCULPTURE

A \$10,000 grant was issued to the Grounds for Sculpture to provide educational programs and free admission to their exhibits for 4th grade students attending Title 1 Elementary Schools in Mercer County, New Jersey.

GOOD GRIEF

In both 2022 and 2023, Good Grief was awarded a combined total of \$20,000 for their nationally respected program that caters to grieving children aged 3-17, young adults aged 18-30, and their parent/guardian, following the death of a parent, primary caregiver, or sibling.



FLEMINGTON FOOD PANTRY

In 2022 and 2023, a combined total of \$24,930 was awarded to the Flemington Area Food Pantry to assist with the growing need for fresh food and supplies in the Mercer County, New Jersey region.

LIFESTYLES FOR THE DISABLED

A \$30,000 grant to the Lifestyles for the Disabled assisted in facilitating their expansion to a third location, allowing them to offer additional programs to their participants.



CHARITY GOLF CLASSIC

The 2022 and 2023 Northfield Bank Foundation Charity Golf Classic distributed over \$207,000 to Staten Island University Hospital Northwell Health, Richmond County University Medical Center, Hunterdon Healthcare, We Feed Woodbridge, and the Flemington Area Food Pantry.

PROJECT HOSPITALITY

A \$100,000 grant was awarded to Project Hospitality to support the construction of their new Community Center located in a low-income housing development in Staten Island, New York. This grant is the largest single grant awarded by the Northfield Bank Foundation.



COMMUNITY HEALTH ACTION

A \$35,000 grant was awarded to Community Health Action of Staten Island for a new Mobile Food Pantry that delivers food to various Staten Island food insecure neighborhoods five days per week.


